Primary Responsibilities: The position of Lead Clinician is responsible for providing direct services that respond to the immediate needs of adult and child victims of domestic violence. This is facilitated by using a family-centered and strength-based model of support. Methods include assessment, advocacy, crisis intervention, therapy, and safety planning to children and their families. Primary responsibilities include managing community relationships that provide program referrals, conducting clinical intakes, overseeing therapeutic group curriculum, co-facilitating therapeutic groups for children exposed to domestic violence, providing parenting support to parents of children exposed to domestic violence and supervising hospital-based advocate and group co-facilitators.

Major Duties:

- Supervise and oversee clinical staff.
- Manage referrals and conduct intakes
- Provide family centered strength-based psychotherapy to adult and child victims of domestic violence
- Facilitate therapeutic groups for children and adults who are victims of domestic violence.
- Assist in recruitment, interview process, and supervision of selected interns.
- Conduct trainings and outreach in order to expand and maintain referral sources in the community
- Attend select community meetings and recommended trainings as approved by the Clinical Services Coordinator.

Knowledge/Skills/Experience Required:

- 3-5 years experience in providing direct services to victims of trauma.
- English and Spanish language preferred
- Training in counseling, domestic violence, crisis intervention, case & program management.
- Knowledge of trauma informed approaches.
- Understanding of cultural and class diversity.
- Understanding of child welfare, criminal justice and probate court systems.
- Excellent written, verbal communication and presentation/training skills- ability to communicate with various constituents.
- Experience in a hospital setting.

Education Required:

Master's degree in social work, counseling or related field and current state licensure in either social work or mental health

Training in evidence-based practices not required but strongly preferred.
